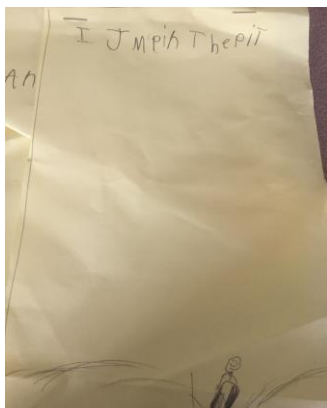
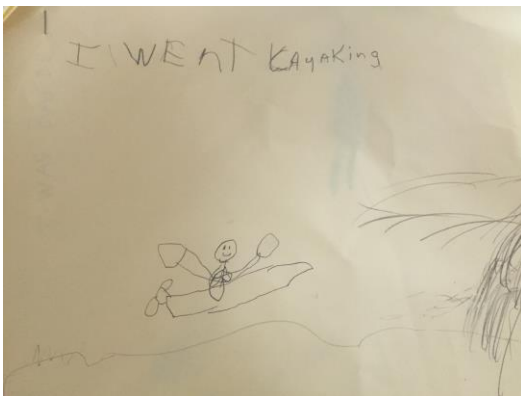
End of the year Kayaking Trip

“I went Kayaking. I was buried. I made a pit. I jump in the pit. I step on sand.”



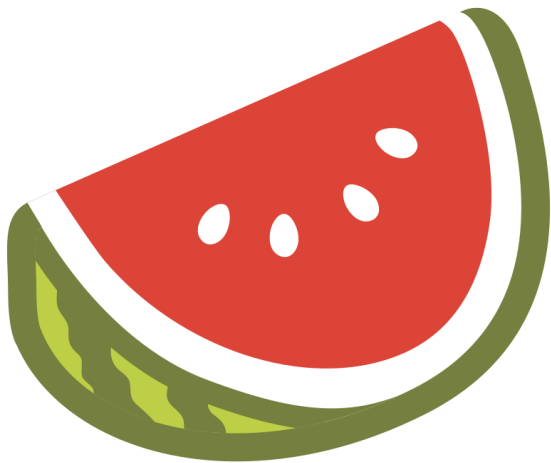
May Day Baskets

For the month of September during the island power outage the students got the chance to go to EcoTarium in Worcester. It was a cross between a kids museum, hands on science museum and nature museum all in one.



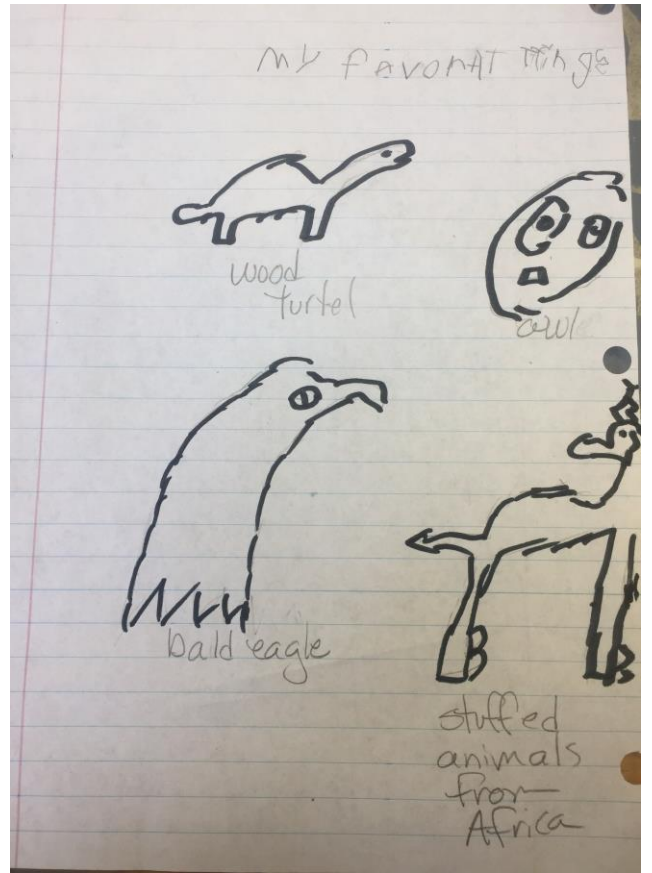
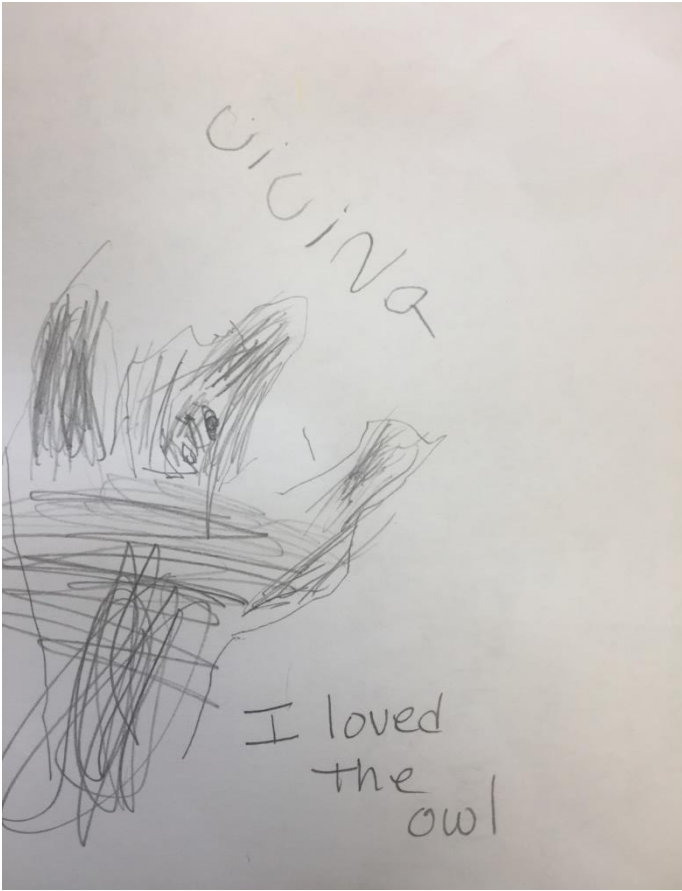
My favorite thing was the wind tunnel. It blew 78.9 mph. My hair was going crazy. It blew around and around, it was fun.
